WHERE CAN YOU GET SAND FOR YOUR SAND BOX?

Our program offers free sandboxes to every family with children under 3 years of age living in Trail and Rivervale. Most parents ask us where to get clean (lead-free) sand to fill it. We recommend that people get sand from a building supply store or from an approved gravel pit. We've tested the sand at West K Concrete in Genelle and we know it's fine. Thanks to their generosity, you can get clean sand for your THEP sandbox free of charge from West K Concrete.

If you're going to pick up sand, call Jim, Justin or Ruth at (250) 693-2430 and drive out to 300 Pipeline Pit Road in Genelle. West K asks that you bring along a shovel and rubbermaid container. If you have any questions, please contact the Community Program Office, (250) 368-3256. Please note that it is illegal to dig up sand on Crown land or road right of ways.

Are You Renovating Your Home This Year?

TIPS FOR LEAD-SAFE HOME RENOVATIONS:

Before you start: Seal off and remove household items from the work area

While you work: Always wear personal protective gear, keep family and pets out of the work area, keep everything clean & tidy, wash your hands and face before taking breaks

Cleaning Up: Remove waste, transport and dispose of waste without raising dust; HEPA vacuum the work area, wash all surfaces, and HEPA vacuum again; wash work clothes separately from regular laundry. Cleaning up can be the most important part!

Update on Teck's Fugitive Dust Reduction Program

Teck has just completed a new building at Tadanac North to store processing materials at the site. The building is part of Teck's "Fugitive Dust Reduction Program" which supports THEC's goal to reduce the levels of metals in the outdoor air. In addition to the Tadanac North building, Teck is assessing the feasibility of a second materials storage and handling building, with construction targeted for 2015.

What is "fugitive dust"? It is dust that escapes from buildings, stockpiles, roadways and other activities on site. These emissions can be quite variable; for example, a windy day can increase wind-blown dust at the site.

Since the mid 1990's, Teck has reduced metal emissions from stacks into the air by over 99%, largely due to installation of the KIVCET lead furnace and various pollution control improvements.
